# MISSION AND HISTORY

Established in 1964 by its namesake, Robert K. Greenleaf, the Greenleaf Center is a non-profit organization working to promote the awareness, understanding and practice of servant leadership. Through his seminal 1970 essay, *The Servant as Leader*, Greenleaf launched the modern movement of servant leadership, challenging the traditional hierarchical approach to leadership by placing the primary emphasis on the well-being of others.

Since 2019, the Center has been housed on the South Orange, New Jersey campus of Seton Hall University. Greenleaf maintains its independence and 501(c)(3) status, while benefiting from the University's rich tradition of service and preparing students to be leaders in a global society. The Center's signature programs include the Greenleaf Online Academy, Greenleaf Research Scholars, the Coffee With Webinar Series, Next Generation Initiative and Robert K. Greenleaf Public Policy Lecture.

## CORE PROGRAMS

Greenleaf's recent affiliation with Seton Hall University provided the Center with a tremendous opportunity to reimagine ways to further advance its mission through more relevant programming to strengthen leaders and organizations.

### Greenleaf Academy

The Greenleaf Academy offers a series of online courses that support professionals who seek to apply servant leadership within the workplace. Upon meeting all course requirements, participants have an opportunity to earn a certificate of completion.

- **Foundations of Servant Leadership:** An introduction to Robert K. Greenleaf's philosophy of a leader who first seeks to serve.
- **Key Practices of Servant Leadership:** An examination of what makes a servant-leader effective.
- **Implementing Servant Leadership:** An in-depth review of strategies and practices used by successful organizations.

### Greenleaf Scholars

The purpose of the Greenleaf Scholars program is to identify and support promising pre-tenured faculty, early career practitioners, and advanced graduate students who wish to study the value and impact of servant leadership in a wide range of organizational or social environments. A signature effort of the Center since 2009, Scholars are selected annually from a national applicant pool. Each cohort receives individual awards of \$2,500 grants to conduct research in the area of Servant Leadership.

## Coffee With Webinar Series

The Greenleaf Center's "Coffee with..." webinar series showcases the inspirational stories of servant-leaders. Each guest has deepened our understanding of the promise of servant leadership and the endless ways in which organizations and society can be transformed for the better. Each webinar features a unique theme that is relevant to the servant-leader practitioner. Various questions are presented to the guest, including questions about their upbringing, career path, and how servant leadership has played an important part in their life.

## Next Generation Initiative

The Next Generation Initiative (NGI) provides a unique experiential learning opportunity designed to immerse high school students in the concept of servant leadership. NGI places a particular emphasis on the characteristics and practices that support developing young people to assume lives of service. Students participate in interactive conversations led by local and international role models known as servant-leader exemplars. More specific learning objectives for the program include the following:

- Becoming more familiar with the concept and practice of servant leadership
- Engaging and interacting with exemplars of servant leadership
- Enhancing critical thinking, listening, and writing skills
- Forming positive, mutually reinforcing peer relationships

## Robert K. Greenleaf Public Policy Lecture

The annual online lecture's vision is to create a viable opportunity to assess societal challenges through the lens of Robert Greenleaf's credo of building a more just and caring society. The event is designed to convene thought leaders and issue experts from a range of sectors, where they examine policy alternatives that hold promise to address the needs of the least privileged and those on the margins of society.



# SERVANT-LEADER EXEMPLAR



## **VAL ACKERMAN**

### **Commissioner, BIG EAST Conference**

Val Ackerman was named the fifth Commissioner of the BIG EAST Conference on June 26, 2013. She was the founding President of the Women's National Basketball Association (WNBA) and is a past President of USA Basketball, which oversees the U.S. men's and women's Olympic basketball program. She has had a long and accomplished career in the sports industry and is one of the few executives in sports who has held leadership positions in both men's and women's sports at the collegiate, professional, national team and international levels. She is an inductee of the Naismith Memorial Basketball of Fame (2021), the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame (2011) and the New Jersey Hall of Fame (2021).

While at the helm of the BIG EAST, Val has presided over the rebirth of the conference following the decision in 2012 of seven then-current BIG EAST schools (DePaul, Georgetown, Marquette, Providence, St. John's, Seton Hall and Villanova) to separate from the original BIG EAST Conference and align with Butler, Creighton and Xavier to form the present configuration. She led the relocation of the conference office to its current site in New York City and has managed the BIG EAST's fruitful partnerships with Fox Sports, which provides wall-to-wall coverage annually of BIG EAST men's basketball on FOX, FS1 and FS2, and with Madison Square Garden, which has hosted the conference's men's basketball tournament since 1983. In 2018, the BIG EAST and MSG entered into a venue agreement extension that will keep the Garden as the home of the BIG EAST tournament through 2028. In 2019, Val also led the negotiations which resulted in the return to the BIG EAST of the University of Connecticut, one of the conference's charter members, effective July 1, 2020.

Val attended the University of Virginia as one of the school's first female student-athlete scholarship recipients. She was a four-year starter, three-time captain and two-time Academic All-American for the Cavaliers' women's basketball team and the first 1,000-point scorer in the program's history. She graduated with high distinction with a degree in political and social thought in 1981 and played one year of professional basketball in France before earning a law degree from UCLA in 1985.

Kassidy Walters is a senior at Ripon College. She will be double majoring in Exercise Science - Human Performance and Psychology with a minor in Coaching. She is currently serving her second year as President of the Student-Athlete Advisory Committee and received the 2021-2022 Student Leadership Award at the Ripon College's Awards Convocation. Outside of the Ripon College community, Kassidy has also involved herself in the City of Ripon and surrounding cities. She has volunteered her time with Habitat for Humanity, read to Ripon's elementary students, and organized a canned food drive for the local food pantry. She has exhibited dedication and dependability for her team and exemplified outstanding service to the campus and community. Kassidy is planning to further her career in coaching while awaiting her final decision on a Masters program.


## LEGACY HONOR

Richard joined Pieper Electric as President in 1960. At that time the family-owned business had 3-6 employees and was doing \$250,000 of business per year. Today, PPC Partners, Inc. employs 1,400 people, has sales in the mid nine figures, and is one of the top electrical contracting firms in the United States. It is known for its management principles, and in particular, its pace-setting continuing education programs addressing all employee needs. Richard served as President of Board of Character Education Partnership, board of Junior Achievement, Milwaukee County Boy Scouts of America, Learning for Life, Boys and Girls Clubs, Present Music, Florentine Opera, Electrical Contracting Council Foundation. He has endowed chairs for professors of servant leadership at colleges and universities. Chairman Emeritus, TDIndustries

Jack joined TDIndustries in 1964, became the CEO and Board Chair in 1980, and in December 2004, retired as CEO. In December 2016, he retired as Board Chair. TDIndustries is a national mechanical construction and facilities service company, headquartered in Dallas, with offices in Austin, Ft. Worth, Houston, Phoenix, and San Antonio.

Founded in 1946, TDIndustries has developed into one of America's premier specialty contracting companies.
